Mid-summer Picnic

The entire congregation is invited to attend our church picnic at beautiful **Dolphin Head Recreation Area** in Hilton Head Plantation on **Saturday, July 16, 4:00 to 6:00 p.m.** The enclosed pavilion and large deck provide stunning views of Port Royal Sound. Adjacent Pine Island offers an opportunity to walk on the beach and take in more of God's awesome creation. Some old-fashioned picnic games and activities are also planned: tug-of-war, sack races, scavenger hunt, water balloon toss, and corn hole.

Family Ministries will provide hamburgers, hotdogs and their fixins, as well as lemonade. Feel free to bring your own beverages as well. Everyone is asked to bring along a generous side dish or dessert to share. Last names beginning with A to P are asked to provide side dishes; Q to Z are asked to provide desserts. Everyone who plans to attend is asked to **RSVP the church office by noon on July 15.**

Directions to Dolphin Head – Enter main security gate of Hilton Head Plantation (tell guard that you are attending St. Andrew By-The-Sea Picnic at Dolphin Head), continuing on Whooping Crane Way approx 2.4 miles to stop sign. Turn right onto Seabrook Drive, bearing right at the fork – Dolphin Head Drive. Continue on Dolphin Head Drive for approx. 1 mile – recreation area and pavilion will be on your left as you approach Port Royal Sound.

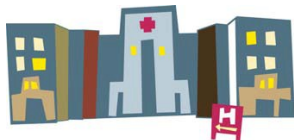

Notify Us About Your Hospitalization

Due to federal privacy laws, hospitals are not permitted to release your name unless you have indicated your permission. If you or someone in your family must be hospitalized, be sure to contact the church directly to let the pastoral staff know. If you are admitted through a normal registration process, also be sure to tell them you are a Methodist and not

simply "Protestant." When you are admitted through the emergency room, this information is not usually taken, and the office would certainly want a call. Help us to be in ministry to you by advising us of hospitalizations, and also let the staff know your wishes in what you would like to have shared.

Diaper Drive July 11-19

Did you know that WIC and Food Stamps don't cover the cost of diapers?? Changing diapers is a dirty job, one that is even more difficult when you can't even afford to put your child in clean diapers. Most low-income families can only afford one diaper a day because it can cost an average of \$100 a month to adequately diaper a child, according to an article in *Redbook* magazine.

And cloth diapers are not a good option, as most parents served don't have washers and dryers. After analyzing those statistics along with the risks for infection, a local ecumenical Bible study group of moms and those who work with young children decided that collecting diapers was a way to help other young families in the community. In 2010, the group collaborated with Bluffton Self Help and held a one-night drive at Chick-fil-A in Bluffton. They collected more than 10,000 diapers. The problem is, those 10,000 diapers only lasted about 4 months.

This year from July 11-19, the group is once again sponsoring a drive, but this time they are partnering with both Bluffton Self Help and with Deep Well. In addition to diapers, they would gratefully accept baby wipes, diaper cream and cash/check donations. The special collection night at Chick-fil-A is set for Tuesday, July 19 from 5-8p.m. and kids eat free with the purchase of any combo meal. **From July 11-19, St. Andrew will be a drop-off location on the island** along with Deep Well. Other drop-offs are Piggly Wiggly and The Corner Perk in Bluffton. (Make checks payable to St. Andrew and note "Diaper Drive")
